OVERVIEW

West Lothian Climate Action Network brought together more than 60 participants from 32 organisations across the region at its Climate Change Gathering on 29 January. Key speakers showcased their organisations, and four workshops highlighted further groups and the chance to meet others, including the new WLCAN team. Community and business exhibitors welcomed visitors to their stands. The successful bids for the first awards from the Scottish Government's Eco Fund were announced by WLCAN's board, with 14 community organisations and small groups sharing £25,679. Further funding opportunities will be available. Neil Barnes, WLCAN's senior development worker, galvanised the event with a pledge from the new team and board to help groups in West Lothian forge inclusive and productive partnerships to address the climate emergency.
